



Seminarians instituted as lectors, acolytes

COLUMBUS, Ohio – The Most Reverend Glen John Provost, Bishop of Lake Charles, instituted 25 seminarians into the liturgical ministries of lector and acolyte, including two - David W. Hardey Jr. (lector); D. Bryan Thompson II (acolyte) - from the Diocese of Lake Charles.

Thompson is a second year theology student and was instituted as an acolyte while Hardey, in his first year of theology studies, was commissioned as a lector.

The installation Mass was celebrated in St. Turibius Chapel in the company of visiting priests, families of the candidates, and benefactors and friends of Pontifical College Josephinum.

In his homily, Bishop Provost spoke to the importance of the day. "The Church is installing young men who are continuing to embrace what they perceive to be the call of God to the priesthood," he said. "The Word of God and the Eucharist are the central focus of the discernment. The Scriptures he will read and proclaim and the Eucharist he will minister are the source and celebration of their prayer and their life in Jesus Christ. So it is now, and so it should be for the remainder of their lives."

Once termed minor orders, the positions of lector and acolyte are conferred to first and second year theologians, respectively. As the candidates were about to be installed, Very Rev. James Wehner, STD, Rector/President, testified to their worthiness: "On behalf of the formation team and the faculty, I can testify that these men have been theologically, liturgically, and spiritually prepared to be installed into the ministries of lector and acolyte."

First-year theology students installed as lectors are commissioned to proclaim the Word of God in the liturgical assembly and to catechize the faithful. During the liturgy, the candidates knelt before Bishop Provost, who held out a Bible to them and said, "Take this book of Holy Scripture, and be faithful in handing on the Word of God so that it may grow strong in the hearts of His people."

The candidates for acolyte, who are second-year theologians, are entrusted with the duties of attending to the altar, assisting the deacon and priest at Mass, and distributing Holy Communion as an extraordinary minister. They may also expose the Blessed Sacrament for adoration. The candidates knelt before Bishop Provost as he held a paten of

bread out to them and said, "Take this vessel with bread for the celebration of the Eucharist. Make your life worthy of your service at the table of the Lord and of His Church."

The Josephinum serves an average of 30 national and international dioceses each

year. Fourteen dioceses had seminarians receive ministries during the liturgy: Atlanta, Brownsville, Columbus, Covington, Fort Wayne-South Bend, Gaylord, Lake Charles, Nashville, Peoria, Phoenix, Steubenville, Taunggyi (Myanmar), Tyler and Youngstown.

Diocesan contingent takes part in NCYC

KANSAS CITY – A total of 99 youth, young adults, and adult chaperones from the Diocese of Lake Charles were among the crowd of 20,886 attending the National Catholic Youth Conference held Nov. 18-21, the largest single gathering of Catholic young people in the United States.

According to organizers, *Christ Reigns!* reverberated with joy, hope and enthusiasm. A total of 163 delegations or groups registered for the conference which was highlighted by live streaming on the Internet of the general sessions, seen by 14,760 unique visitors and 30,580 views. Twenty-eight bishops attended and more than 250 priests registered with groups.

The Diocese of Lake Charles contingent represented 17 parishes, including

ice of Youth and Young Adult Ministry for the Diocese.

"This once in a lifetime pilgrimage to celebrate the fact that Christ Reigns in the hearts of our young people was an experience that will remain with them forever,"

Mrs. Thibodeaux said. "Through-out the weekend, our young Church was exposed to the Light of Christ as they participated in general sessions, workshops, interactive games and activities and more. I am confident that this experience had a

lasting effect on all who attended."

Vatican Secretary of State Angelo Sodano sent greetings from the Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI and NCYC attendees also received a taped video message from Miguel Diaz, the U.S. Ambassador to the Holy See.

Special collections contributions stay in Diocese

LAKE CHARLES – Two very special second collections will be taken up in the churches of the Diocese of Lake Charles during the month of December and contributions to each collection remain here for use by the local Church.

This weekend, Dec. 12-13, the second collection will be for the Retirement Fund for Diocesan Priests. On Christmas Day, everyone is asked to be extra charitable in making a financial gift to the social services programs of the Diocese, which aids those most in need in Southwest Louisiana.

In the Diocese of Lake Charles there are currently nine retired priests and our Bishop Emeritus. The group represents 488 years of priestly ministry to this local Church.

In addition, there are nine additional men who are either nearing retirement age or, for some, whose health could force retirement. Diocesan policies dictate that a priest must submit his letter requesting retirement at 75 and has an option to retire earlier, at age 70.

These men have given their lives to the faithful of the Church in Southwest Louisiana and deserve to have, in their retirement years, a reasonable and comfortable life. Funds from this collection aid in providing retirement funds to supplement personal retirement finances the priests have acquired over their years of service.

The Diocese estimates that it expends more than \$250,000 annually for the health and welfare of its retired priests.

With the possibility of even more retirees in future years the need for additional generosity from the people of the diocese is important.

"The Christmas second collection for Catholic Charities of Southwest Louisiana, Diocese of Lake Charles, is very important to our outreach ministry," Father Wayne LeBleu, Secretary for the Ministry of Pastoral Services, said "Twenty-five percent of Catholic Charities' budgeted revenue for this fiscal year comes from the collection. I encourage everyone in the Diocese to be as generous as possible in these difficult times."

So far in 2009, the following amounts have been paid directly from donations made to Catholic Charities: \$2,800 in funeral expenses, over \$2,700 in medicine expenses, over \$2,370 in mortgage payments, over \$42,000 in rent payments, and over \$7,500 in utility payments.

"I would like to thank all of the parishes of the Diocese who have made financial contributions, donations of food and provided people who volunteered their time and talents to help Catholic Charities," Father LeBleu said. "Second Harvest of Greater New Orleans and Acadiana has experienced a drastic shortage of available food due to a 90 percent cut in legislative funding in the current budget. I would encourage all to continue to donate to Catholic Charities and to volunteer their time with the agency."
