



Deacon Conner ordination Saturday, Dec. 18

LAKE CHARLES – Deacon Scott Conner, currently chaplain at St. Louis Catholic High School, will be ordained to the priesthood for the Diocese of Lake Charles on Saturday, Dec. 18, at a 10 a.m. Mass in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. The Most Reverend Glen John Provost will be the ordaining prelate.

A priestly ordination on the Saturday before Christmas is reminiscent of a revered tradition, that of celebrating ordinations during the Ember Days of Advent, specifically Wednesday, Friday and Saturday after the Third Sunday of Advent. Being ordained on December 18, Deacon Conner will join the following priests serving in the Diocese of Lake Charles who were also ordained on an Ember Day in Advent: Monsignor James Gaddy, Fathers Marshall Boulet, Ed Brunnett,

Ernest Corriveau, Joe Goselin, James Winiarski, Roland Vaughn, Brian King, Augustine Mulanjanany, John Poerio, and Fred Russi.

A reception will follow the Ordination at St. Louis Catholic High School, 1620 Bank Street.

Deacon Conner was ordained to the Diaconate on May 10, 2008 by Bishop Provost in the Cathedral. He has served in a number of pastoral assignments in various parishes since his ordination – St. Philip Neri Church in Kinder; Our Lady of the Lake Church in Lake Arthur; St. Eugene Church in Grand Chenier, Sacred Heart of Jesus Church in Creole; Our Lady Star of the Sea Church in Cameron; and St. Henry Church in Lake Charles. Bishop Provost appointed Deacon Conner as chaplain at St. Louis in May 2010.

A 2009 graduate of the

Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus, Ohio, he received a Master of Divinity (MDiv) as well as a Baccalaureate in Sacred Theology (STB) – a pontifical degree conferred by the Josephinum in affiliation with the Pontifical Lateran University in Rome. He also holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from St. Joseph Seminary College in Covington and attended Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans.

In preparation for the final step in his long road to the priesthood, Deacon Conner said he feels a mixture of thankfulness, but at the same time a measure of trepidation.

“When the bishop let me know he was going to ordain me in December, I remember at that time having those two feelings simultaneously,” he said. “Thankfulness that the day was going to be in the near future and trepidation because of the real-

ization of the kinds of obligations and responsibilities of the office of a priest. I have continued to go through those emotions for the last month or so.”

Deacon Conner believes that the time he has spent as a deacon and working in the parishes will be helpful in his transition to the priesthood.

“I think that as time goes on, I will understand more and more how this period has been of benefit to me,” Deacon Conner said. “I think it has been helpful to have gained a better understanding of the identity of a deacon. I identify with who I am as being a deacon at this moment and I suppose the same thing may happen when I become a priest.”

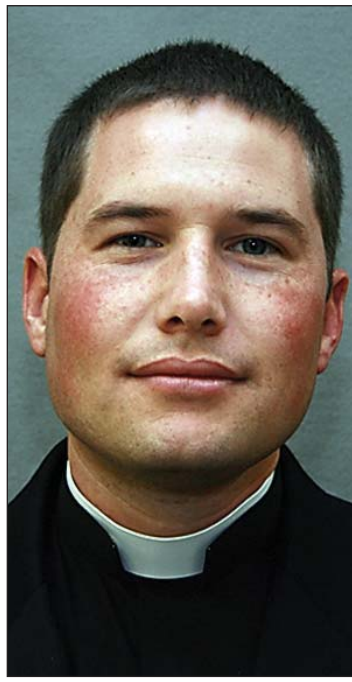
He sees his current ministry as that of servant.

“I serve the Bishop. I serve the priests in sacramental ways at the altar and I serve the parish in various

capacities,” he said. “The same thing, it seems to me, will be part of what it means to be a priest, but in a slightly different way. I suspect that as time goes by I will continue to see the many ways God has prepared me to be a priest by first being a deacon.”

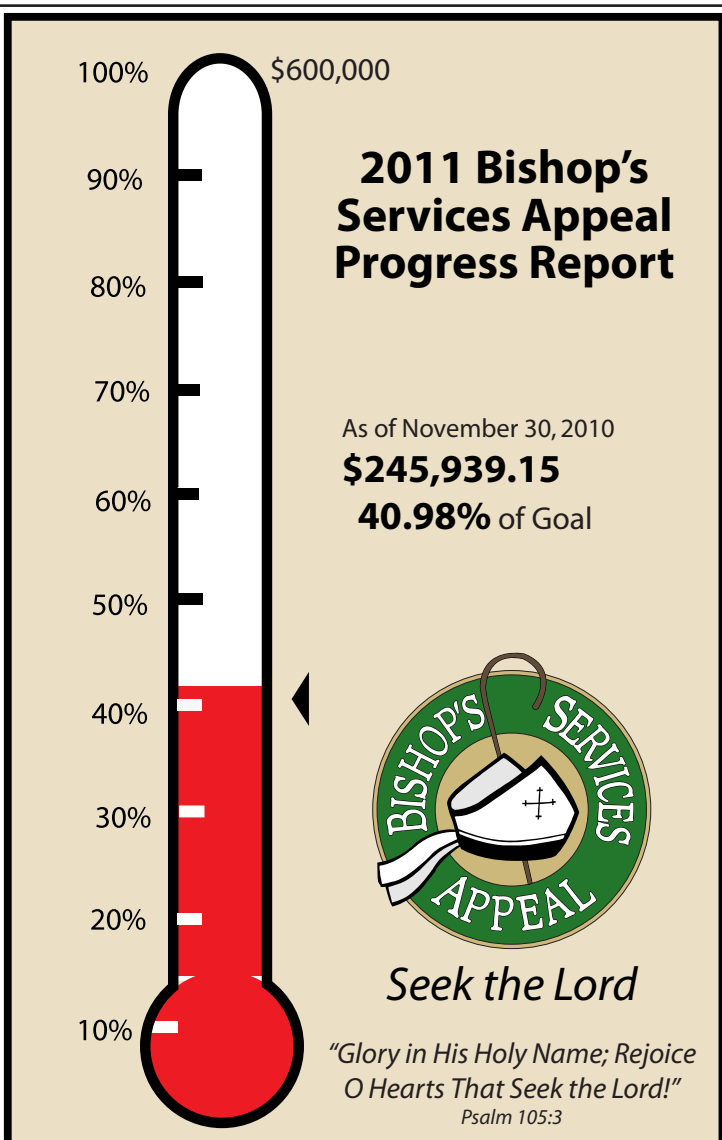
Deacon Conner will celebrate his first Mass on Sunday, Dec. 19 at 2 p.m. in Our Lady of Seven Dolours Catholic Church in Welsh. It will be a homecoming, of sorts, for him.

“I suspect it will be a profound experience to say Mass there,” he said. “It is the parish where I think, even though I didn’t grow up there physically, I grew up there spiritually - where I began attending Mass more frequently as a young adult and being formed in the Church’s teaching. I haven’t had many opportunities to go back there because my assignments have kept me

In January and June of 1951, two church parishes were canonically established in the area of what is now the Diocese of Lake Charles. St. Joseph Church in Elton was established on Jan. 9, 1951 and entrusted to the priests of the Society of the Divine Word. Slightly more than five months later, Bishop Maurice Schexnayder of the Diocese of Lafayette established St. Lawrence Church in Hathaway. In 1975 church moved to a new site in Raymond, just west of Hathaway.
