# Bishop's Gala orchestra celebrates Sinatra's centennial

LAKE CHARLES – The renowned Nelson Riddle Orchestra will provide a "Tribute to Frank Sinatra" at the Fourth Annual Bishop's Gala set for Saturday, Dec. 12, in the Lake Charles Civic Center, the Solemnity of Our

Lady of Guadalupe.

The Orchestra is generally considered the "World's Most Recorded Orchestra" having recorded with Frank Sinatra, Nat "King" Cole, Ella Fitzgerald, Rosemary Clooney, Peggy Lee, Judy Garland, Dean Martin, Barbra Streisand, Linda Ronstadt and many others. The program features vocalist Bryan Anthony for a Centennial Celebration of the musical collaboration of Sinatra and Riddle, which has been called "the greatest musical marriage in American popular music." Christopher Riddle, Nelson's son, currently directs the orchestra.

Doors open at 6 p.m. for a VIP social with general admittance at 6:30 p.m.

Tickets are \$125 each and a table for 10 is \$1,250. They can be purchased in the parishes of the Diocese, at the Chancery (414 Iris Street) and online at live.lcdiocese.org.

### Bishop Provost celebrates 40th reunion with classmates

ROME - In this 40th year of his priesthood, Bishop Glen John Provost attended a reunion with his 1975 seminary classmates in the Eternal City. The event was two years in the making and the group resided at Casa O'Toole at the Pontifical North American College (PNAC) as the guest of the school's rector Msgr. James

During the five-day event, there were numerous liturgical events with a concelebrated Mass at the Altar of the Chair in St. Peter's with Cardinal Raymond Burke, Patron of the Sovereign Military Order of Malta, as the principal celebrant and Archbishop Leonard Blair of the Archdiocese of Hartford, Conn. as the homilist. On another occasion, the group concelebrated Mass at St. Paul-Outside-the-Walls with Cardinal James Harvey, Archpriest of the Basilica of Saint Paul Outsidethe-Walls, as the principal celebrant and Bishop Patrick Zurek, the Bishop of Amarillo, Tex. as nomilist. In addition, for other Masses during the reunion, Bishop Provost was the celebrant at a Mass at the PNAC and Bishop Michael Mulvey was the homilist. On another day, Bishop Michael Cote of Norwich, Conn. was the celebrant and Father Jerry Riney was the homilist.

On Wednesday of the week, the group attended the customary audience with the Holy Father. Cardinal Burke personally requested that the Holy Father allow a photograph to be taken of the group. "The Holy Father graciously consented," Bishop Provost said. "As we departed from his presence, he turned to us as a group and very sincerely requested, 'Pray for me.' We all assured him of our prayers."

Bishop Provost noted, "There was a great deal of reminiscence, including some

ceremony (June 29, 1975) itself, especially what Pope Paul VI, the ordaining prelate, had said. One of these contained words addressed specifically to us prior to the ordination." The Holy Father said, "Always remember that vour ecclesial service to God's holy people will be effective to the extent that your personal commitment to Jesus Christ remains strong and vital. For, in the words of St. Peter: 'Although you have never seen Him, you love Him, and without seeing, you now believe in Him and rejoice with inexpressible love.' The Pope continued, "It must always be so, if you are to fulfill the destiny to which the Lord calls you."

"Those were not just beautiful words," Bishop Provost said. "They contained signifi-

surrounding the ordination cant advice, and we were all touched deeply to remember them and to see how they had sustained us throughout our priestly lives.

On the last evening, Msgr. Checchio hosted a dinner for the class with the faculty of the North American in the Red Room of the College.

Bishop Provost pointed out that Casa O'Toole is the location of the Institute for Continuing Theological Education at the PNAC, since its beginning in 1971. "The Institute is an extraordinary opportunity for priests to study, pray and become zealous disciples of the Lord in a newer and deeper way," the Bishop said. Father Keith Pellerin, pastor of St. Philip Neri in Kinder, attended the Institute during a three-month sabbati-

### Seminarian Burse Endowment Challenge takes on more 'challenge'

LAKE CHARLES – The Seminarian Burse Endowment Challenge offered by the Catholic Extension Society has nearly been achieved and with that quick work comes an additional offer from Extension, according to Deacon Glen Bertrand, Director of Development.

Contributions establishing new burses and additional gifts to current burses for the challenge since January 1 now stand at the cusp of the \$50,000 goal that provides a \$25,000 contribution from Catholic Extension.

"Because we have nearly reached our goal, Extension has challenged us to raise an additional \$50,000 – using the same criteria of a contribution of at least \$1,000 – with another matching gift of \$25,000 from Extension," Deacon Bertrand said. "The Diocese has happily taken the challenge to increase the funds that help pay for the educational expenses of our seminarians."

The Seminary Burse Endowment is a permanent fund set aside to provide income for the education and training of future priests. The 90 current burses total \$1,687,181.03. Donors can established a seminary burses in honor or memory of a loved one, in the name of especially well-loved priests (there are a number of these types of burses already established), or an organization with any amount of money. Additional contributions to current burses can be added at any time.

The principal amount of the fund is never spent but invested, with the interest used each year for education expenses of those men studying for the priesthood for the Diocese of Lake Charles. Since the principal is never touched, this fund is truly a "gift that will give forever." Donations made to any seminary burse will continue to support the education of seminarians in perpetuity.

"With this new challenge, we have the opportunity to further enhance these funds," Deacon Bertrand continued. "Just remember that qualifying contributions must be new or increased gifts of \$1,000 or more. Lesser donations are appreciated but they won't qualify for the matching challenge."

All funds must be received before December 31, 2015 to count for the matching gift.

"The Diocese continues to enjoy record levels of seminarians in formation for the priesthood with 16 again this fall," Deacon Bertrand said. "With this blessing comes the challenge of providing the necessary financial support for their studies while they are in formation. Our current costs amount to over \$600,000 per year.


"We hope that those who can will do everything possible to support the seminarians, Deacon Bertrand continued. "Catholic Extension is one of the most generous supporters of our Diocese. The Seminarian Endowment Challenge gives the Diocese another way to raise much needed funding to support our development efforts for seminarian education."


