Foods are offered for birthday celebrations and club meal activities. After care programs are following the Smart Snack Guidelines.

Nutrition Education Goal: Provide nutrition education related staff development opportunities on an annual basis.

Two schools are providing nutrition education to their staff during the teacher in service at the start of school year. One school provides information about the food and nutrition program and its goals at the teacher in service. The Child Nutrition program provides training to the Food Service staff at the yearly in service and monthly training lessons for professional standards training hours.
